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## 10 sprinklers installed

#### **KALWARI POND REJUVENATION**

The Kalwari Pond Rejuvenation project transformed a key water body through cleaning, embankment strengthening, slope stabilization, and the addition of solar lighting, play areas, and waste bins—revitalizing the ecosystem and community space

Sankalp Vatikas are now fully functional, with farmers successfully cultivating vegetables like chili, brinjal, tomato, and cabbage. The initiative has led to a collective saving of ₹15,376 in one month, promoting self-sufficiency and economic relief.

A high-tech thermal drone was handed over under the Vanjeevan initiative to enhance wildlife monitoring protection in the Pilibhit Tiger Reserve









#### **Tuk Tuk Gilhari**

- Tuk Tuk Gilhari launched two eco-friendly cottage stays in January, welcoming guests to experience ethical animal care and sustainable living.
- Partnered with Shri Vishwakarma Skill University, bringing in interns for hands-on learning in agriculture
- Hosted Tomatina and Ambience Playschools, introducing children to animal welfare and environmental awareness in a fun, interactive way.
- Continued animal rescues and treatments, with several animals rehabilitated back into natural surroundings.
- Developed plant beds & improved infrastructure to enhance the sanctuary environment.





## **Pond Rejuvenation**

Our initiative in Haryana's Nuh district demonstrates restoration's impact. In Tauru block, neglected ponds in Chharoda and Chundika villages are being rejuvenated through filtration chamber construction and desilting, creating 22 ML of surface water storage. This transformation benefits humans and animals, enhances beauty, and promotes health.

#### Sarvottam Model

M3M Foundation, in partnership with Earth Rakshak Foundation, advanced the Sarvottam Model for sustainable waste management by:

- Expanding Rural Solid Waste Management departments through community-selected Earth Rakshaks.
- Making progress in waste segregation, daily weighing, and compost production.
- Ensuring financial sustainability via compost sales, recyclables, and user charges.



#### **30 HEALTH CAMPS**

Organized under Project Kartavya, benefiting **3,881** construction workers with check-ups, expert consultations, and free medicines

## 3,050 BLANKETS

Donated to homeless & underprivileged individuals to safeguard them from harsh winter conditions

#### 22,000 RATION KITS

Distributed to construction workers on the occasion of Chairman Sir's birthday to support their nutritional needs and improve quality of life

#### **16 HEALTH CAMPS**

were successfully conducted under the Sarvoday Swasthya Yatra, screening over **2,200 individuals** for parameters like blood sugar, cholesterol, thyroid, and more

#### **75 FOLLOW-UP VISITS**

Visits to villages such as Nijampur, Patuka, and Panchgaon were made to monitor patient recovery, ensure medication adherence, and facilitate referrals to Community Health Centres and hospitals when necessary





#### **525+ PARTICIPANTS**

attended **12 awareness sessions** on menstrual hygiene, nutrition, and the importance of immunization across multiple villages

#### **MOTHER MEETINGS**

were held in villages like Gwarka and Mandarka focused on maternal and child health, emphasizing nutritious food for pregnant women and children, and the importance of regular vaccinations





#### **600**+ UNIFORM DISTRIBUTION

Uniforms were distributed to 600+ children

#### **FOUNDATIONAL LITERACY & NUMERACY**

386 children participated in Foundational Literacy and Numeracy (FLN) activities at seven community learning centers using 20 activity-based learning modules

#### INTERNATIONAL MOTHER LANGUAGE DAY

The event featured **195 participants** who celebrated cultural identity through storytelling, poetry, and traditional games conducted in their native languages.



#### **FORMAL EDUCATION**

233 children were successfully enrolled in formal government schools

#### **4 IMPOWER YOUTH CLUBS**

were formed at the Rewla Khanpur center Pari Youth Club, 5 Star Youth Club, Shiksha Youth Club, and Happiness Youth Club promoting youth leadership and engagement.

#### **MAGIC ENGLISH SLL PROGRAMME**

Classes take place in 9 iMpower Clubs located in Gurugram, directly benefiting **679 students and 18 teachers** by improving English language skills among primary school students.





#### INTERNATIONAL MIGRANTS DAY

elebrated with 354 participants, including 335 children, through a rally and a movie day out, honoring the experiences and contributions of migrant communities

#### **5** SENIOR SECONDARY SCHOOLS

were equipped with 25 digital tablets each, creating Digital Libraries and enhancing digital access for students

#### **AWARENESS PROGRAMS**

On women's health, hygiene, cyber safety, and drug abuse was held in Rewla Khanpur Perna Basti, with over 50 participants including women, adolescent girls, and boys





#### **NATIONAL GIRL CHILD DAY**

Over 390 people participated in a rally, Nukkad Natak, and a screening of the short film "Muskan," which promoted gender equality and raised awareness about issues like female foeticide

#### **SARVODAY GYAAN RATH**

Continued with 54 school visits and Sandarbh Kendras, assisted with 6 health camps, and distributed dustbins to raise sanitation awareness.

#### **REWLA KHANPUR CENTER**

117 children had been enrolled at the Rewla Khanpur center, with ongoing efforts to develop foundational learning, confidence, and holistic development among children







#### **MOBILE SCIENCE LAB PROGRAM**

98 sessions were held at 10 government schools in Gurugram, engaging 1,342 boys, 1,434 girls in hands-on science education through activity-based learning

#### **SELF-DEFENSE WORKSHOPS**

were conducted at all iMpower locations, empowering adolescent girls and women with essential personal safety skills

#### YOUNG INSTRUCTOR LEADER PROGRAM

Engaged 538 students from 10 schools through 23 sessions, reaching 447 boys, 387 girls, and 23 teachers. The initiative focused on leadership & communication via peer-to-peer science learning.

#### **RENOVATION OF GSSS AKEDA**

At GSSS Akeda, ten classrooms were rebuilt due to severe structural damage, with waterproofing and reinforcement work to create a safe and durable learning environment for students and staff

#### SAAKSHAR SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME

- 480 scholarships were awarded under the SAAKSHAR scheme this year, directly supporting the educational journeys of 234 male and 272 female scholars
- BUNIYAD, a sub-component supporting foundational education, provided 11 scholarships to young girls this year.
- Jazbe Ki Udaan, focused on encouraging ambitious young women, awarded 23 scholarships, highlighting our commitment to gender equity and female empowerment.







#### 1,030 YOUTH WERE TRAINED

in 2024-25 tenure across five iMpower Academies located in Jagdalpur, Leh, Tauru, Noida, and Panipat-Samalkha

#### **14 VOCATIONAL TRADES**

were offered across these academies, including Beauty Therapy, Solar PV Manufacturing, Electrician Training, Data Entry, and Architecture & Construction, etc

#### **BASIC SKILL AND PUBLIC COURSE (BSPC)**

A total of 74 youth completed the Basic Skill and Public Course (BSPC) program, with 11 students selected for government competitive exams like SSC and Police Services.





#### **73% OF YOUTH**

secured job placements. The highest placement was recorded in Leh with 100%, followed by Tauru with 82%

#### **VENTURE SETUP**

1,505 youth were supported in starting their own ventures or becoming selfemployed under the Enterprise Development Initiative

#### **45 COMMUNITY MEETINGS**

were conducted across various clusters to raise awareness about skill development opportunities and promote local entrepreneurship







#### **VERMI-COMPOST TRAINING**

Hands-on vermi-compost training was conducted in 8 villages where vermi beds were installed. Participants learned to use earthworms for composting, producing nutrient-rich fertilizers. Follow-ups monitored growth and progress, with over 30 farmers trained in sustainable practices that generate income.

#### LALA JI KI RASOI

20 women from rural & construction site areas participated in a 5-day training program under Lala Ji Ki Rasoi, in collaboration with Ekta Foundation. The training covered bakery skills, FSSAI registration, credit linkage, financial literacy, branding, & kitchen hygiene.





#### STREET PLAYS FOR SKILL AWARENESS

From March 17 to 24, 2025, street plays were held in 32 villages of Samalkha block, Panipat. The plays aimed to raise awareness about technical education for unemployed youth and women, offering free training in 11 trades such as electrician, data entry, sewing, beauty therapy, and nursing.

#### **AASTHA MASALA ENTERPRISE**

2 enterprising women from Subhasheri have launched their own spice brand, Aastha Masala. This month, they received spice grinding and drying machines, helping them scale up production and deliver high-quality spices to local markets.







#### **IMPOWER SKILL ACADEMY, SAMALKHA**

2-day Mobilization Orientation Workshop took place on February 27-28, at iMpower Skill Academy, Samalkha. Staff learned about mobilization strategies, planning, community engagement, and overcoming challenges.



## STRENGTHENING LIVELIHOOD IN LADAKH

On February 24, 2025, the M3M Foundation hosted the launch of Sea Buckthorn products at the IFC Centre, graced by the presence of Hon'ble Member of Parliament Haji Mohd Haneefa Jan. During the event, he interacted with members of the Riyul Sea Buckthorn Cooperative Society, whose inspiring journey began in Lukzung village, Nubra Valley, with mobilization support from the Foundation. The MP lauded their efforts and highlighted how the initiative has empowered the marginalized youth of Ladakh by providing sustainable livelihoods and a sense of purpose. Dr. Aishwarya Mahajan, President Foundation, along with Mr. Mayank from SIDBI and Dr. Binujeet Radhakrishna from Aide-et Action, also attended the event and emphasized the Foundation's ongoing commitment to supporting the cooperative's growth.
